



She is a published author of two medical textbooks, Therapy in Pediatric Dermatology: Management of Pediatric Skin Disease and Pediatric Dermatologic Surgery.

Dr. Benjamin's nominated honorary positions includes a seat on the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD) Coding & Reimbursement Committee and Vice President of the Women's Dermatologic Society (WDS).

Dr. Benjamin received the inaugural Women's Dermatologic Society Volunteer of the Year Award and served as a WDS Board of Director Member (2018-2022). She volunteers her time on the Foundation for Ichthyosis & Related Skin Types (FIRST) Board of Directors and is past Treasurer of the Palm Beach County Society for Dermatology & Cutaneous Surgery (2019-2021).

Latanya is a mother and passionate advocate for women and children. She holds an ambassador role with Dove to support the self-esteem in young girls. Serving as a physician mentor, her personal journey in medicine is recorded in the recently published book **Un Doctor por favor!** encouraging young Hispanic students to consider a career in medicine and other STEM sciences.
